SUBJECT: 71S Accession Board Application Guidance for Officer Training School Candidates

- 1. Air Force Office of Special Investigations (AFOSI) is a highly competitive, board-driven selection process for officer training school (OTS) applicants. Interested applicants should select 71S as their #1 AFSC choice on their OTS application. AFOSI will consider applicants after they are selected for OTS attendance and does not hold bearing over an applicant's acceptance into OTS.
- 2. The 71S assignment officer will be provided application packages of OTS selects requesting AFOSI duty. Available quotas to fill with OTS accessions changes annually in accordance with Department of Air Force manpower assessed needs. Each OTS board will be complemented with a 71S applicant board comprised of senior Special Agents and professional staff who review each 71S applicant's package via a "whole person" concept.
- 3. OTS selects chosen by the 71S board are then assigned to undergo an agent suitability investigation (ASI) administered by AFOSI, which is a stand-alone investigation to evaluate an applicant's emotional, physical, and overall suitability for 71S duty. A favorable ASI would result in the officer attending agent training at the U.S. Air Force Special Investigations Academy in Glynco, GA, collocated with the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) after successful OTS course completion. The 71S assignments officer would facilitate follow-on assignments after training.
- 4. OTS applicants to 71S may reach out to local AFOSI units (refer to http://www.osi.af.mil/ for unit listing) with questions. 71S is a unique duty; applicants should commit themselves to make an informed decision about applying to AFOSI. Non-approved applicants are referred to Air Force Recruiting Services for reclassification into an alternate career field.
