

SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS

OFFICER AGENT POSITIONS (NON-AD OSI)

OSI considers O2 – O3 applicants for retraining. All other ranks must be fully qualified. Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) Criminal Investigators Training Program (CITP) and Basic Special Investigators Course (BSIC). Applicants of other ranks who have completed CITP, DEA, USPS, CID, or the FBI Academy may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

QUALIFICATIONS/ELIGIBILITY

Required:

- Military experience
- Leadership experience
- Law enforcement experience/training
- Eligible for Reserves*

*If you are not eligible for the Air Force Reserves, OSI cannot offer you an IMA position.

Desired:

- CITP or agency equivalent (DEA, USPS, CID, and FBI Academy)
- Fraud-related experience (accounting, auditing, etc.)
- Technical surveillance countermeasures
- Forensics skills/training/experience
- Cyber skills/training/experience
- Digital forensics
- Foreign languages
- Diverse backgrounds (overseas experience, intel, etc.)

2. Complete the OSI Initial Screening Questionnaire located below and forward to AFOSI.HQ.DPR@US.AF.MIL.

**If selected, final approval of any assignment to OSI is based on satisfactory results from the Agent Suitability Investigation (ASI) and can take up to 45 days.

REQUIRED TRAINING

If you are not an accredited OSI agent (or have been out of the program for 5 years) and are selected to join OSI's Reserve program, you will need to commit a significant amount of time in the 24 months following your gain date to complete initial and upgrade training.

If you are an 1811 and have completed CITP, DEA, USPS, CID, or the FBI Academy you will be required to complete the courses listed below. These courses will take approximately 48 days (non-consecutive) outside of your 12 ATs and 24 IDT periods. Your ATs and IDTs will be used to complete Career Field Education & Training Plan (CFETP)/On the Job Training (OJT) requirements.

- Basic Special Investigators Course – Distance Learning (BSIC-DL): Virtual for 10 training (business) days.
- Basic Extension Program (BEP): Virtual for 2 weeks or 10 training (business) days. There is a test out option for graduates of BSIC-DL.
- Intermediate Counterintelligence Course (ICIC): 3 weeks or 14 training (business) days – 4 days distance learning (virtual) followed by 2 weeks in-residence at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, NJ.
- Mission Qualification Training (MQT) Course: Depending on the course you are vectored for the training will be approximately 10-14 days virtual or in-person.

If you are not an 1811 or an 1811 without CITP (or equivalent course), you will be required to complete the courses listed below. These courses will take approximately 200 days (non-consecutive) outside of your 12 ATs and 24 IDT periods. Your ATs and IDTs will be used to complete Career Field Education & Training Plan (CFETP)/On the Job Training (OJT) requirements.

- Criminal Investigators Training Program (CITP) & Basic Special Investigators Course (BSIC): Special Agent trainees must successfully complete CITP and OSI's BSIC at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) in Glynco, Georgia. The courses are held back-to-back and last for approximately 5 months.
- Basic Extension Program (BEP): Virtual for 2 weeks or 10 training (business) days.
- Intermediate Counterintelligence Course (ICIC): 3 weeks or 14 training (business) days – 4 days distance learning (virtual) followed by 2 weeks in-residence at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, NJ.
- Mission Qualification Training (MQT) Course: Depending on the course you are vectored for the training will be approximately 10-14 days virtual or in-person.
